

Our termly bulletin aims to keep parents and carers informed of all the personal development activities happening in school, how to support your child and how to get involved with the programme in school.


#### SANDY GUNN - CAREERS IN ENGINEERING

An interesting look back in time at the story of Sandy Gunn and his Spitfire and an exciting look forwards into the future and the 4th industrial revolution considering quantum processors, the 'internet of things', nano-technology, cyborgs and 3D printing.

Students who study DT and Engineering were selected to hear from our guest speakers about project AA810 - the rebuilding of the famous Spitfire. The project is a partnership based on a 3 year cycle as part of a prestigious network of schools and engineers in aerospace. They have exciting plans for the future and aim to inspire as many young people as possible to join this field of work.

#### YEAR 13 MOCK INTERVIEWS



Feedback on our careers events last term has been very positive.

During the pandemic we were forced to consider an alternative to our mock interview experience and moved the event online. Whilst initially an unusual experience for all we soon realised that this opened up a much wider field of potential interviewers and much more flexibility. It also mirrored, and continues to, the recruitment methods seen in industry. The student feedback is overwhelmingly positive too. It is for this reasons we have continued with online interviews this year.

Surveying the students in advance about their career aspirations enabled us to work along side professionals from the 'Education and Employers' network to match interviewers with students chosen career paths in most cases. We were also able to work closely with Reed recruitment using their HR professionals to conduct interviews and offer interview tips to students.

Our panel this year included doctors, dentists, engineers, armed forces and representatives from the DWP, Bank of America.

## LIFE AFTER CROSSLEY HEATH EVENT

This years' event was bigger and better than ever before with even more guest speakers able to join us as well as partners from further afield offering digital talks and resources.

We collaborated with Russel Group universities Durham, Newcastle, Bristol and Sheffield to deliver sessions all about making course decisions, the application process, study skills and preparing for university life. Huddersfield University shared important information about student finance and brought along their student ambassadors for some student Q&A.

For those not planning to go to university we hosted Deloittes and Covea delivering sessions all about apprenticeship routes to employment with degree qualifications and Calderdale College sharing information on T Levels and apprenticeship options in our area.

This whole school event will see representatives from a wide variety of local/national universities, colleges, training providers and employers exhibiting in our sports hall. Students will have designated visiting periods during the school day where they can ask questions and explore potential future steps. More details will follow in due course.





To coincide with National Careers Week Year 12 will take part in work experience for 1 week from the 6th - 10th of March 2023.

Letters have been sent to parents and students have been sent a guide including letter templates and top tips.

Work experience is an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of a working environment, develop some 'soft skills' and observe first hand what a job really entails. Working in the field your child is interested in is beneficial but it is important to remember that *any* work experience (in addition to any existing part-time employment) is valuable. It will look great on their CV/personal statement and they may even be able to ask their host employer for a reference when applying for a future job.

#### IN THE CLASSROOM

In Personal Development lessons Year 7 are completing a unit all about healthy routines, influences on health, managing changes in relation to growing up and puberty, unwanted contact, and FGM. Later this term they will move on to an exciting enterprise unit in which they will work in groups on business ideas. To finish the term they will do some work on e-safety and revisit our school values and British Values.

Year 8 are learning about equality of opportunity in careers and life choices, and different types and patterns of work in the future, financial decision making and their role in the economy. Later this term they will move onto a unit on emotional wellbeing and steps we can take to promote positive mental health.

Year 9 too have been looking at mental health with a focus on positive coping strategies. Following this they will move on to look at financial decision making and the economy.

Year 10 have started the year looking in more detail at healthy relationship expectations, relationship myths, and the impact of the media and explicit images. Leading nicely on from this are a sequence of lessons exploring influence and its impact, drugs, gangs, role models and the media.

Over the autumn term year 11-13 will be looking ahead to their next chapters. Year are focusing on managing relationships, what makes healthy relationship as well as spotting characteristics of un-healthy relationships. Following this is a unit on employability linking to their work experience.

Following mock exams Yr13 will be exploring the skills and knowledge required for independent living.
